#### RACES/ARES (Radio Amateur Radio Civil Emergency Service): Tom Karnauskas

- Field Day, the emergency communications exercise/contest was held in June. Every state was contacted, except for Maine. There were 14 participants and about half of them spent the night at Crane Creek Park. - Shirley Woodfield indicated that the MN Citizen Corp newsletter suggested that volunteer groups need to deelop relationships with Amateur Radio.

### Skywarn: Dave Purscell

- Activated the night of 11-Jul. Lots of communication with the NWS. Noted there did not appear to be any spotters out in Waseca.
- July meeting walked everyone through the procedures for activating and opening the WX center. Also provided a demonstration of how City Watch works.

### Law Enforcement: Todd Schwanke

## Steele County Emergency Manager Report: Mike Johnson

- Construction at the Fire Station is scheduled to begin on 17-Jul.
- Active Shooter Drill September 12th. Will consist of a table top exercise in the morning and a functional drill in the afternoon.
- Moving forward with 800 MHz systems. Towers are being installed. Radios used at the Republic National Convention will be purchased as surplus after they are used in the metro.
- Safety Allley will be set up at the Steele County free Fair.
- Volunteers need to complete IS-700 and IS-100 at a minimum. Individuals that make decisions for their groups must also take IS-300 and IS-400.

## HSEM Report: Craig Strand

- There is a Presidential Disaster Declaration for 5 MN counties.
- Counties are getting together the week 0 21-Jul to discuss 800 MHz.

#### Other Business/Round Table Discussion:

- During the SKYWARN report, Mike Johnson suggested that those that use City Watch need to let the commissioners know how it is being used.
- Kim Purscell indicated she will write a letter to the Pearl Street Joint Powers Board, as approved at the June CAER meeting.
- Dave Purscell inquired if access might be available in Blooming Prairie to install an Amateur Radio digi-peater. This

would be used for SKYWARN operations. Tom Karnauskas suggested expanding on the idea and developing a plan to use Amateur Radio for reporting flood gauge readings as part of the digi-peater network.

- Recommendation was approved to suggest that the next available HSEM grant be used to enhance interoperability.
